**Louisville, KY (February 27, 2014)** – Got cabin fever? Do SCIENCE this Spring Break with the Kentucky Science Center! The Science Center's popular *School's Out Science Camps* will be running from March 31 – April 4 and feature such themes as "Pirate Science" for K – 1<sup>st</sup> grade and "KY Unearthed" for 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Additionally, the Science Center is offering their first *Drop & Date Night Out*, an evening where parents can drop off their children for an evening of science fun while they enjoy dinner and a movie in the Science Center's all new Digital Theater.

The ALL NEW 4-Story Kentucky Science Center Digital Theater allows for even more program versatility, with the showing of documentaries, Hollywood faire, live streaming, classic movies and special events.

NOW SHOWING at Kentucky Science Center Digital Theater:

- *Watermelon Magic*, an early childhood movie about the science of growing and the spirit of sharing, chronicles a season on the family farm, as young Sylvie grows a patch of watermelons to sell to market.
- *Jerusalem*, narrated by celebrated English actor Benedict Cumberbatch, immerses audiences into one of the world's most beloved cities.
- *The Last Reef* gives viewers the chance to fly across iridescent tropical reefs, brush through a cloud of a million jellyfish, and visit an alien world beneath the waves.
- *Titans of the Ice Age*, now in stunning 3D, transports viewers to the beautiful and otherworldly frozen landscapes of North America, Europe and Asia ten thousand years before modern civilization
- *Thor: The Dark World*, the Kentucky Science Center's second Hollywood Feature in their all new Digital Theater, continues the big screen adventures of Thor, the Mighty Avenger, as he battles to save Earth and all the Nine Realms from a shadowy enemy that predates the universe, itself.

The new Digital Theater will also help give parents a night to themselves at the Science Center's first ever *Drop & Date Night Out* on Friday, March 7. The evening includes drop off for children in grades K – 6<sup>th</sup> from 5:00 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. Parents can then enjoy their own dinner offsite (price of parent meal not included) from 5:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. Complementary tickets to a Hollywood feature beginning at 7:30 p.m. are included for the parents as a part of *Drop & Date Night Out*. Children will be provided dinner by Subway as well as a full evening of camp-style science activities led by Science Center staff. Pickup for the evening is at 10:00 p.m.

*Drop & Date Night Out* reservations for members are \$50 for two parents and one child (each additional child \$15) and for non members they are \$60 for two parents and one child (each additional child \$20). Speaking of camp-style activities, Kentucky Science Center *School's Out Science Camps* return this spring break with four themed camps for students in Pre-K – 6<sup>th</sup> grade! Campers in grades Pre-K – K can explore the planets, comets and the night sky with "Twinkle Little Star," while K – 1<sup>st</sup> graders will learn how to walk, talk

and sail like Captain Jack with “Pirate Science.” In “Modern Marvels,” a camp for 2<sup>nd</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> graders, campers will learn about some of history’s most important and unusual inventions and even engineer one of their own! Campers in grades 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> will uncover all things Kentucky in “KY Unearthed” as they investigate our regional flora, fauna and amazing geological formations.
