Kentucky Science Center celebrates YES! Fest with *REUSEapalooza*

Beginning February 6, REUSEapalooza will explore food, water, land and energy

Louisville, KY (Friday, February 06, 2015) – Kentucky Science Center will open a second iteration of *REUSEapalooza* on February 6 as a part of their ongoing temporary experience, the *Great Big Science To-Do*.

The experience, which focuses on the science behind sustainability, will be included with general admission and run through May 30 of this year. *REUSEapalooza* is hosted in conjunction with the YES! Fest sponsored by the Arts & Cultural Attractions group of Greater Louisville, Inc. and will be housed in the fully updated first floor gallery which will be home to the *NEW Science in Play* early childhood experience when it opens in Summer 2015.

“The Science Center team is excited to be ‘going green’ this winter with *REUSEapalooza*,” said Science Center Executive Director, Joanna Haas. “Focusing on simple ways we can work towards sustainability, this experience will showcase the science behind everything from composting to renewable energy.”

The run of the experience will be divided by theme:

- **FOOD** (February 6 – March 8)
- **WATER & LAND** (March 13 – April 26)
- **ENERGY** (May 3 – 30)



The first month will focus on food and sustainability with activities such as indoor gardening, compost science and learning how to reduce your carbon footprint with what you eat.
