


School's Out Science Camp COVID-19

School's Out Science Camp will operate in alignment with CDC and state guidelines such as smaller class sizes, mask wearing, social distancing, and increased sanitization. Our team is ready to welcome your camper into a fun and safe hands on experience with our camps. Our building and team health protocols have been reviewed by the local health department. Please note, the guidelines may change based on new information or additional state or local recommendations.

Tips for preparation for your camper's experience:

- Campers ages 6 and older will be required to wear masks, campers under the age of 6 may wear a mask if that is your preference, but they are not mandatory.
- Daily health screenings will be performed for staff and campers. Anyone with fever or symptoms of illness will not be permitted to stay.
- Camper belongings brought from home will be restricted to lunchboxes and any personal PPE.



• Per the CDC, we may no longer provide Lost and Found bins. Please label EVERYTHING that you send with your child. We will hold lost items if we know who they belong to.

Camper and Staff Safety Procedures:

- Our registration, drop-off and pick up are in our main building entrance to maximize social distancing.
- Only approved camp staff and campers will be permitted in classroom areas to minimize exposure.
- Our camp class groups will be scheduled to reduce any intermixing of groups.
- Staff will be trained to implement and encourage your camper to follow healthy practice guidelines:
 - Frequent hand washing breaks into the day's experience.
 - Additional access to hand sanitizers in every classroom, exhibit and all general areas. Staff and campers will be required to wear appropriate PPE.

Cleaning Procedures:

- We have increased sanitizing and cleaning protocols for all camp classroom surfaces, supplies and exhibit areas.
- We may ask your camper to help clean their areas to help maintain a healthy classroom.

COVID Case Notification Plan:



- If any camper develops a fever or symptoms of illness, they will be isolated, and parent/guardian will be contacted for immediate pick up. Cleaning protocols will be enacted for any zones they visited.
- If any camper or staff is sick, they will be required to remain at home until it is safe for them to return.
- If a positive case is identified, then our campers' families will be immediately informed.
